___ Stenton's Preservationists \$50,000

Named after his father's village in Scotland, Stenton was James Logan's country house and plantation. Completed in 1730, the Logan family lived there until about 1860. It became a museum administered by the NSCDA/PA in 1899.

___ William Penn's Founders \$10,000

The Founder of Pennsylvania relied on a talented young James Logan to help manage his affairs in the colony and carry out his legacy.
